Must-visits also include Viana do Castelo, Ponte de Lima, Bragança, Chaves, Amarante, Lamego or Vila Real. Places of great heritage and historical interest, of culture and a very own and welcoming way of living.

Churches and monasteries, museums and castles, gardens and the rich architecture are part of an unforgettable itinerary. It is also impossible not to enjoy the numerous Natural Parks, the generous rivers, the sea and the mountain that surround this region. While

stopping to catch one's breath, it is always possible to enjoy the abundant and rich gastronomy, Douro Wine, Vinho Verde and the famous Port Wine. Here you can also enjoy an endless number of different experiences ranging from cultural activities, concerts, popular festivals and parties to the more extreme ones, such as mountain or water sports, sea or river. The North of Portugal is all this and it is also a region that has four UNESCO's sites: the Historic Centre of Porto, the Historic Centre of Guimarães, the Douro Valley and the Côa Valley are World Heritage Sites. Also noteworthy is the increased attractiveness of this region, with cities like Porto which won the title European best destination and the consequent significant increase in the number of hotels and restaurants. Another important factor of attraction is undoubtedly the fact that this region is served by the Porto airport, which means that any main European city is less than 3 hours away.



PORTO. TRADITION AND MODERNITY IN A COSMOPOLITAN ENVIRONMENT.

There are in the city of Porto, capital of the North, a thousand charms and nooks that are worth discovering. Porto is one of the oldest city in the country and, as such, its route is winding and picturesque.

Strolling through its streets and feeling the pulse of the city is a unique experience. Porto is a city of culture and leisure, a cosmopolitan and contemporary place, with the title Best European Destination in 2012, 2014 and 2017. It is a must to go on a journey by tram to the mouth of the river Douro and see the excellent beaches and outdoors cafés, visit churches and monuments and come across the non-conformist modernism of the new contemporary buildings by architects like Siza Vieira, Souto de Moura or Rem Koolhaas.

HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL HERITAGE. ONE UNIQUE LEGACY.

In Porto you can go on a medieval trip and pound the historic centre, visiting the Cathedral or the Clérigos Tower. By tram or on foot it is a unique experience going down to the pier and experiencing the sensation of going on a cruise on one of the famous rabelo boats that sail along the river Douro, admire the six bridges of the city, visit the Porto Wine Cellars and sip this characteristic wine, in a cosy and refined atmosphere.

Casa do Infante, church of São Francisco de Assis, Palácio da Bolsa, the riverfront and the well-preserved streets of Ribeira and Miragaia are also recommended. The modernity of Casa da Música and the Museum of Contemporary Art of Serralves complement the visit.

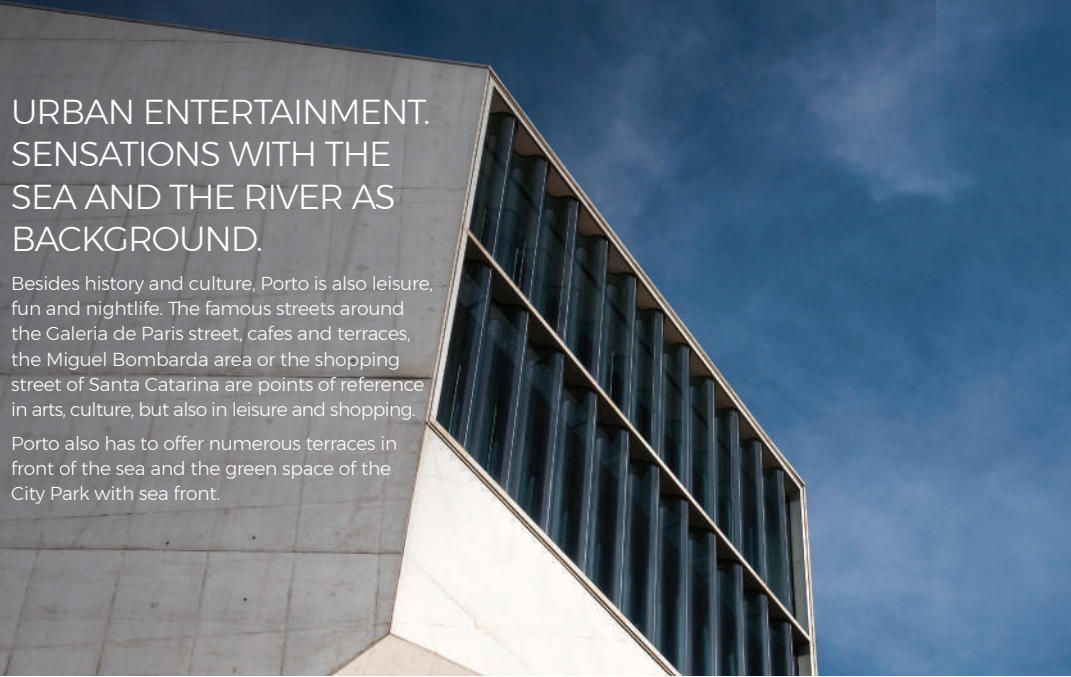

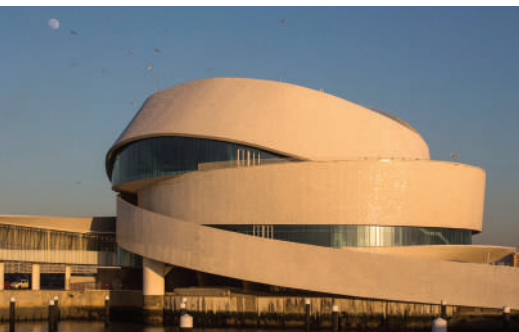

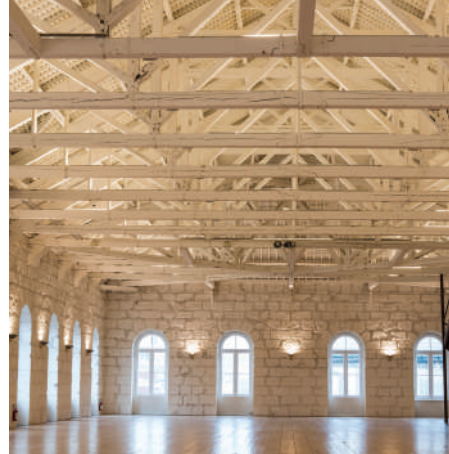

A DESTINATION FOR CONGRESSES AND EVENTS.

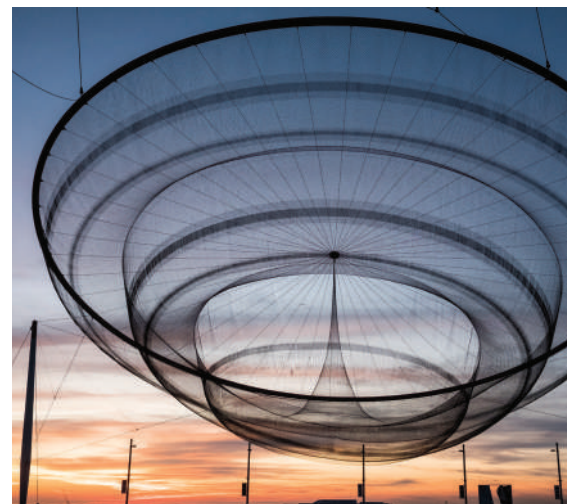
In Porto and Northern Portugal there are ideal conditions to host business and scientific events in well-equipped and emblematic buildings.

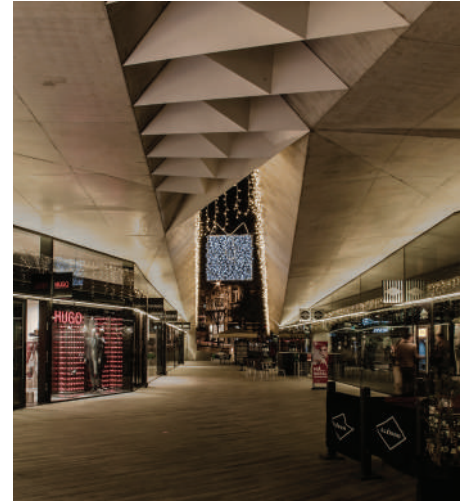

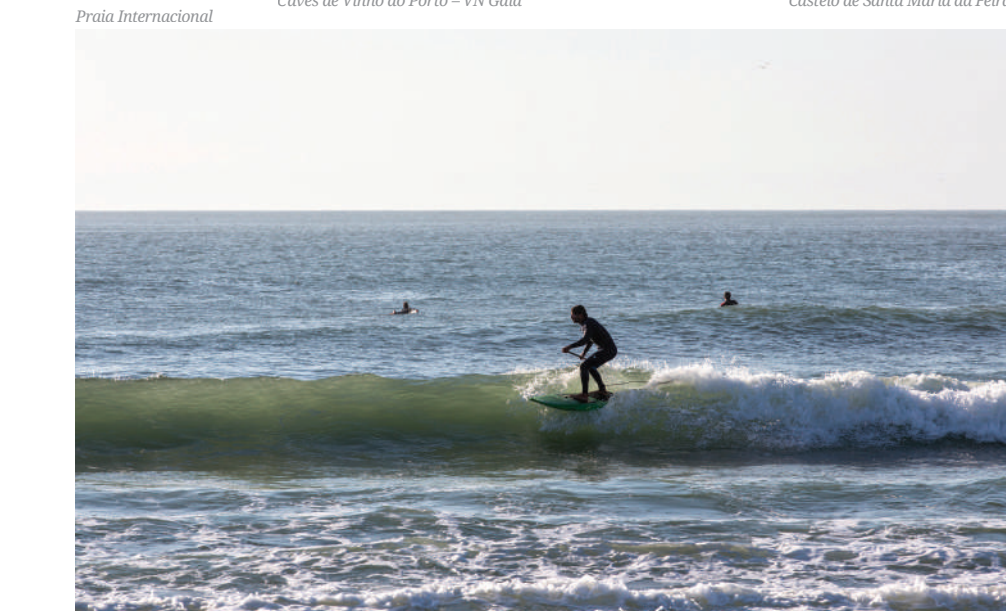

DOURO, WORLD HERITAGE SITE.

It was the first wine region in the world to be demarcated and regulated in 1756. The wild slopes of the valley have been transformed, through the work of generations, into terraces to plant the vineyard that produces the famous Porto Wine, excellent DOC Douro wines, sparkling wines and Muscat wines.

This impressive landscape was declared by UNESCO a World Heritage Site in 2001 as a living and evolving cultural landscape - Alto Douro Wine Region. In the Valley of the Douro river and its tributaries, the harmonious interaction between Man and Nature coexists with another, possibly more natural or inhospitable - the one of the Natural Parks of Douro International, of Alvão and, even farther, the Arouca Geopark.

A BREATHTAKING SIGHT.

The Douro River flows from the Spanish border to the east of Porto and, depending on the time of the year, its slopes may be decorated with almond and cherry trees in full bloom, or with the grape harvest labour.

THE WORK OF MAN IN PERFECT BALANCE WITH NATURE.

It is recommended to visit the Douro Museum in Régua, the Casa de Mateus Foundation in Vila Real and the countless of quintas that produce Port Wine and Douro. These quintas offer very rich experiences, not only in oenology and gastronomy, but also in participating in activities related to the grape harvest and the preparation of wines. The magnificent restaurants and the hotel units and charm accommodation are also benefits.

Discovering the Douro International Natural Park and the Alvão Natural Park is equally captivating.

Located in the Alto Douro region, Vila Nova de Foz Côa saw its name crossing borders thanks to the discovery of its Paleolithic rock engravings in the open air. Now a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, is one of the largest archaeological centres of rock art in Europe.

It is essential to sample the traditional recipes served with the renowned wines, in quintas or in excellent local restaurants. The grape harvest, lagaradas (foot-treading) and other traditional events are equally unique. Going on a cruise on the Douro River, on one of the many vessels available, and admiring its escarpments is very popular by those who visit the region. Traveling by train and enjoying the scenery is an equally unforgettable experience. There are many extreme sports and a wide variety of river water sports that one can practise. ATB, 4x4 off-road tours and helicopter tours complement a wide range of ways to enjoy the Douro Valley.

The Minho Region has unique characteristics associated with a natural landscape of enormous beauty and biodiversity. Marked by the intense green of fields and vineyards, where the beautiful Minho landscape meets with the contagious joy of festivities and popular festivals and with the unparalleled hospitality of its people.

CITIES, HISTORICAL TOWNS AND UNFORGETTABLE PLACES.

The journey can begin in Viana do Castelo which has many stories to tell. The city of Braga is also a top tourist spot in the region and was the European Youth Capital in 2012. It reveals an interesting dialogue between tradition and religiosity with the modernity and youth of the student populations. Guimarães, a historic city where Portugal was born, was the European Capital of Culture in 2012, and is also a must-stop whenever cultural events are concerned. Here we can highlight the Vila Flor Cultural Centre and its rich programme, where the Guimarães Jazz festival stands out.

Old manor houses and pousadas, an extremely rich gastronomy, festivities, popular festivals and vinhos verdes are other attractions that can be enjoyed in this privileged area.

Churches and monuments of unparalleled beauty seduce the traveler as well as a rich folk culture, music, folklore, stories and handicrafts. The Portuguese Way of St. James, way walked by the pilgrims who flock to Santiago de Compostela since the ninth century, passes through Minho.

TRÁS-OS-MONTES. A REMOTE AND MYSTERIOUS REGION

Trás-os-Montes is the perfect name for this area in the interior of Northern Portugal. Majestic mountains and plateaus, untouched historical villages and towns, purifying and healing thermal waters, traditional cuisine and the genuine hospitality of a people very proud of their customs.

RUSTICITY AND BEAUTY TYPICAL OF THE “WONDERFUL KINGDOM”.

Beautiful cities like Chaves, Bragança, Miranda do Douro or places like Vidago, Montalegre or Macedo de Cavaleiros are worth a long visit. This remote and mountainous region, proclaimed a wonderful kingdom by the writer Miguel Torga, offers unique sceneries, such as the almond trees in full bloom, historic villages, natural landscapes and a rich gastronomy. Bragança and its historic centre are situated on the extreme part of Montesinho Natural Park - one of the wildest forest areas in Europe, with a huge diversity of flora and fauna, where species such as the Iberian wolf, deer, fox and boar are protected.

MYSTICISM, LEGENDS AND A PECULIAR LANGUAGE.

Daily life has not changed much over the centuries, and the most isolated villages and towns have a very peculiar rustic beauty. The residents still have a way of life very attached to traditions. It is especially fascinating to visit places such as Miranda do Douro, Mogadouro, Torre de Moncorvo and Freixo de Espada à Cinta. Customs and mysticism are still very present here, starting with the *Lhéngua mirandesa* (dialect from Miranda do Douro), the enigmatic legend of Mizarela bridge in Montalegre and the celebration of Friday the 13th, the event of folk medicine of Vilar de Perdizes, the fair of smoked meat of Vinhais or the famous Podence *Caretos*.

Trás-os-Montes is a rich and peculiar area regarding gastronomy, highlighting the purest quality olive oil and alheira, a very popular and typical smoked sausage from Mirandela.

The festivities extend till the days leading up to Ash Wednesday, and include colourful costumes, cheerful parades and traditional music, attracting visitors from all over the world. Invigorating hot springs and wild nature are attributes of a well-protected area with an admirable beauty.

HOW TO GET HERE



AIRPLANE

Porto International Airport is located 15km from the city centre. The links to the city are done by an excellent public network (Bus, Metro and Taxi). There are links to the main European capitals, Lisbon and the rest of the country, also provided by the Campanhã Railway Station.

Porto is located 300km north of Lisbon, in a privileged geographical position, in terms of access to the main European capitals. The main airlines fly directly to Porto.

CAR

Porto and Northern Portugal is served by a modern road network, which enables those who come from Galicia, Algarve, Lisbon, Coimbra, or from any part of the country to easily reach the city and from there to any other destination.

BOAT/CRUISE SHIPS

Leixões Cruise Terminal/APDL port is just a few kilometers away from the centre of Porto and receives cruise ships from several parts of the world.

TRAIN

The destination has international trains, *Alfa Pendulares*, Intercidades, Interregional, regional and urban, allowing connections to various destinations the country and abroad.

Distances, in flight times, from Porto to some of the main European destinations:

- Madrid: 01h10 (8-10 flights/day)
- Paris: 02h05 (11-13 flights/day)
- Amsterdam: 02h40 (3 flights/day)
- Berlin: 03h15 (5 flights/week)
- London: 02h05 (7-9 flights/day)
- Rome: 02h45 (3 flights/week)

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
